

How to Get Started with Toastmasters Pathways

Open a browser on your computer or smart device and go to www.toastmasters.org. Log in with your email address and password. If this is your first visit you will be prompted to establish an account. Once you log in with your password, you will probably be taken to your Toastmasters “**My Home**” web page. If not, you can find this link under the drop-down list by hovering over or clicking on “**Welcome, Name**” at the top of the page. **Your Home** page will look something like this:

This is where you can choose an educational path. Your first is free because you already paid the new member \$20 fee. Additional paths will cost \$20 each, and you can work on as many as you like. For first time Toastmasters, I recommend that you finish your first path before purchasing more, and of course, you can work on multiple paths simultaneously. Although this does take a bit more management.

The “**View the Navigator**” icon will give you additional resources that help you learn how to use the Toastmasters Learning Experience and how to get the most out of it. I’d suggest clicking of various links and just see what information is presented. As you can see, there are varied resources that explore many different aspects of Toastmasters.

The “**Goto Base Camp**” icon is the same as on earlier pages, it’s here as a convenient link so you don’t have to navigate backwards to access it.

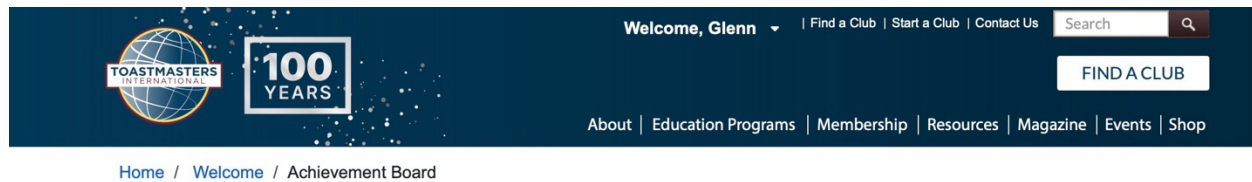

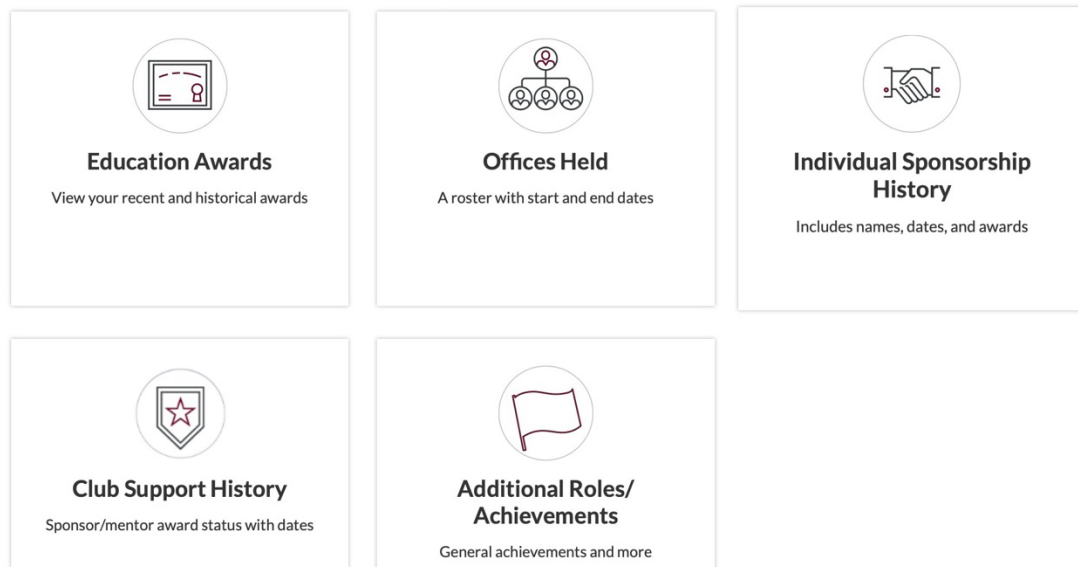
Frequently Asked Questions

Your “**My Home**” Pathways web page also has an icon for “**Achievement Board**”. This is a page dedicated to keeping track of your Toastmasters historical data, including your educational awards, elected and appointed offices you’ve held, and so on. At first you will have no data, but

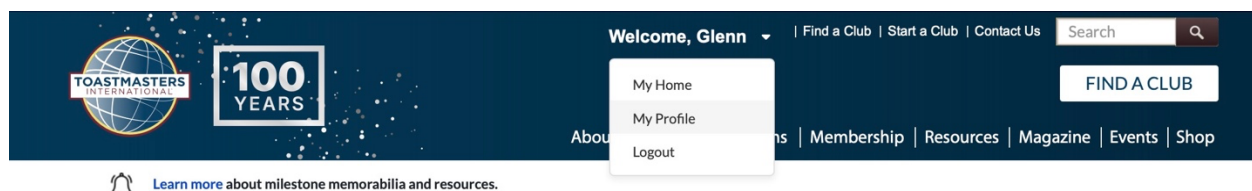
as you progress through Toastmasters, this page becomes a valuable resource for keeping track of your achievements and history.

Under your “**Welcome Name**” link at the top of the page, is a second link, “**My Profile**”.



The “**My Profile**” link will take you to a page that provides information about you as an individual. Some of the links on this page allow you to edit the information and add additional personal information.

Base Camp is your resource for managing your Pathways educational learning experience. The screenshot below is a bit more complicated than yours because I’m enrolled in four Paths and also shows additional options, plus a scroll bar showing my completed Paths. Your page will start to look like this if you stay in Toastmasters for a while.

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When you click on a new Path, you will be taken to an Overview of the Level 1 projects. As shown below, none of the 4 projects have been completed. As each project is completed, a check mark will be highlighted to the left, and once all four have been completed, the path can then be completed.

One interesting thing to note is that projects do not have to be completed in order, and projects in different levels can be completed whenever you choose. However, you can only complete Paths in order. Level 1 must be completed before Level 2 can be completed, and so on.

Another option in Base Camp is the “**Achievements**” tab. This is actually different from the “**Achievement Board**” on your “**My Home**” page. The “**Achievements**” tab lists your completed

Pathways educational awards (Levels 1-5 plus Path completions), Feedback Badges and Pathways certificates. Note: the “2” next to the icons indicates that this Pathways level has been completed twice. There is no limit to how many times a Pathways educational path can be completed.
